

Favorite Scripture

Matthew 6:24-34 this is the NIV

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? 26 Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? 27 Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

28 "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. 29 Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. 30 If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? 31 So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. 33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. 34 Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own



Rebecca "Squirt" Letsome shares, "I am a worrier, I have been my whole life. I struggle with anxiety and panic attacks. And like most worriers I worry about everything and everyone; climate change, hunger/starvation, police brutality, my family health, the homeless, drivers on I-95 and commuters on the metro. All of this and more is on my heart all of the time. I remember one particular time in middle school where I was having routine panic attacks and after one attack I decided to pick up the children's bible I had and just open it. It opened to THIS chapter and passage. It was perfect and spoke to me. It helped me remember that I was not alone. That the Divine Trinity was looking out for me and not just me the whole world. That my worry only keeps me from experiencing the present beauty of the Divine Trinity's creation. I come back to this passage often, when I feel powerless or hopeless, it gives me strength and hope and reminds me of God's love."
